Script: “In Remembrance” - Last Supper Scene

Jesus invited his disciples to a final Passover meal before his death.

The Passover meal was to commemorate how death had passed over the people of Israel, because God had instructed them to cover their door posts with blood from a slain lamb.

Jesus did two significant acts in the course of that last meal together.

At the start of the meal, Jesus gets up from the table. We hear the tinkle of water from the basin, then with a towel wrapped around him, he moves from one disciple to the next. In the role of a low-ranking slave, he washes the soil from the feet of his disciples.

He then took some bread and broke it. The bread represents how Jesus' body would be broken for us. **“Do this in remembrance of me”**. He took the wine and handed it to his disciples; the wine represents the blood of Christ that would be spilled for us. **“Do this in remembrance of me”**.

He must die so we can live.

As you exit please partake of a piece of bread and a grape as a reminder of what Jesus has done for you.
