Engage kids' hearts through a dynamic and interactive Bible story, worship, and prayer experience in a Large Group setting.

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Basic Truth: I can trust God no matter what

Leader enters.

Video (Media Package): Theme

OPENER

LEADER: "FANNY Greetings, earthlings! It's been a great month so far at [your environment's name]. We're finding out how we can boldly do what needs to be done . . . with initiative!

Video (Media Package): Theme Transition to Life App

"Initiative is seeing what needs to be done and doing it.

Video (Media Package): Life App Transition to Theme

"God can help us take initiative so we notice the things around us that aren't quite right or the people who need our help. And we don't just SEE those things. We do something about them! We lend a hand. We make things better. We show God's love in everything we do and say.

"To kick off our time today, I thought we could have some fun with our very own SPACE-celebration. See what I did there?

"We have four games to play during our space party, so we'll orbit around the room to play! First, let's divide into two teams—the [color] team and the [color] team.

Divide the group into two teams, making sure to evenly divide among ages. Have the teams line up in two different lines, next to station #1.

"At each station, only one person from each team can go at a time. When that person is finished, the next person in line goes, and so on.

FANNY, LINDA, JAMES each man one station

Move around the room to each station. Explain how to play each game and demonstrate as you explain.

"We'll start here with station number one. As you're probably aware, there's no gravity in space. Which means you're weightless! It's a weird sensation, and we'll get a taste of it with this 'weightless race.' First, you'll pick up a spoon and close your eyes—no peeking! While your eyes are closed, you'll attempt to pick up a cotton ball, carry it to your team's bucket, and drop it in. It doesn't SEEM hard, but when you can't tell how much something weighs, it's tricky! At the end of the race, we'll see which team got the most cotton balls in their bucket.

"One you've tried to drop in your cotton ball, you'll come over here to station number two—the 'moon rock bounce.' Here you'll try to transport a moon rock (hold up a balloon) from one side of the moon—I mean room—to the other. Just grab a balloon, start at either line, and bounce your balloon all the way to the other line. You can hit your moon rock in the air, but it can't hit the ground. If it does, bring it back to the starting line and try again. As soon as you make it across, move on to station number three.

"Station number three is the 'Saturn ring toss,' where you'll pick up a ring (hold up a hula hoop), stand behind the line, and attempt to throw the ring around Saturn (point to the beach ball). Each person will get two chances to try to land a ring.

"Lastly, we'll finish up with station number four, the 'rocket ship portal.' You'll make a paper rocket like this (hold up the completed paper airplane), with paper in your team's color. Then stand behind the line, launch your rocket, and try to get it through this portal (point to the hanging hula hoop). There's no need to wait your turn here at station number four. Once you get here, go ahead and make your rocket and launch it. If you see someone who needs help folding, go ahead and help them.

"When all of you have finished all four stations, I'll tally the points, and we'll find out which team is victorious. Let's go—starting off with [kid's name] and [kid's name] in the weightlessness race! (Reference the first two kids in line.) Three . . . two . . . one . . . blast off!

AUDIO: Fun instrumental music

Comment on the action, encouraging the kids as they complete each section. Remind them of the rules if necessary.

When everyone has completed all four stations, add up the teams' points. Count the number of cotton balls in each team's bucket from station #1. Ask the kids to raise their hands if they landed a ring around Saturn at station #3, and if they got their rocket through the hoop at station #4. Add these numbers together on the dry erase board and come up with the final point totals for both teams. (Don't worry about being too exact on this; just keep it moving.) Congratulate the winning team.

"Amazing, everyone! That was out of this world! You saw what needed to be done at all of those stations, and you got . . . it . . . done. Talk about initiative! Stay on your feet, because now it's time for us to sing to God and celebrate His love."

WORSHIP.

LEADER: FANNY "Before we worship, let's watch this video together.

Video (Media Package): Live Loud Video from Get Reel

"When we take initiative, we can jump into action and do what God has called us to do. It's like what Paul wrote in our memory verse, Colossians 3:23. Say it with me."

SLIDE: Memory Verse

LEADER and KIDS: "Work at everything you do with all your heart. Work as if you were working for the Lord." (Colossians 3:23, NIrV)

LEADER: "Let's sing this song together and tell God that that's exactly what we're going to domake a move and live for Him!

Video (Media Package): "Make a Move" Dance Moves Music Video

"As we worship God, we can celebrate all that He's done in our lives. We have so much to thank Him for! Let's sing this song and tell God how grateful we are for His amazing love.

VIDEO: "Thank You" / track 7 from This Love

SLIDE: Theme Background

"It's so fun to sing and celebrate God with you You can have a seat."

BIBLE STORY

Before you begin the story, display the large, yellow felt circle—either on the stage wall or on posterboard on an easel.

SETTING UP THE STORY

LEADER: FANNY/LINDA. "We've been talking all month about Nehemiah (*hold up Bible*). Nehemiah was a man who showed some amazing initiative to do a job that he believed God wanted him to do.

"When we first began, Nehemiah was living in Persia. He had an important job as cupbearer to the king. Things in Nehemiah's life seemed to be going just fine.

Add the eyes and smiling mouth to the yellow circle, to make an emoji face.

"But then, Nehemiah got some bad news.

Turn the mouth upside down so it's a frown.

"He learned that the walls around the city of Jerusalem had been destroyed, and its gates had been burned. This was a big deal, because it meant that God's people who lived in Jerusalem were in danger.

"Nehemiah took initiative. He asked the king to let him travel to Jerusalem and see the damage for himself. When he got there, he saw that there was a lot of work to do. The job must have seemed nearly impossible! But with God's help, Nehemiah rallied all the Jewish people in the city, and they started to repair the damage together.

"The workers faced some trouble from the people in the lands around them . . .

Take the frowning mouth off the emoji and add the grimace mouth in its place.

"... and Nehemiah had to tell the officials to stop charging the people extra for food."

"But in the end, Nehemiah and the Jewish people stayed focused on the work at hand. God helped them rebuild the entire city wall and its gates—in only 52 days!"

Take the grimace mouth off the emoji and add the shocked open mouth in its place.

GRATITUDE

LEADER: "The Jewish people in Jerusalem could now live safely. Nehemiah knew the reason for their success: God had helped them finish the work!

Take the shocked open mouth off the emoji and add the smiling mouth in its place.

"Nehemiah wanted everyone to honor God by reading His law. He called all the people together. Everyone gathered at sunrise to hear the prophet Ezra read from God's Word.

Put the scroll on the emoji, covering up the mouth.

"Everyone bowed down with their faces to the ground as they praised God for all that He had done for them. Ezra read God's Word all the way until lunchtime. The Levites also read God's laws to the people, and they helped the people understand what those laws meant."

SADNESS

LEADER: "As the people listened, they started to feel very sad.

Take the scroll off the emoji. Turn the smiling mouth upside down so that it's a frown. Add the tear below one of the eyes.

"They realized that they hadn't been following God's laws. They were upset because they realized how they had wandered far away from God. But Nehemiah, Ezra, and the Levites told them not to weep or be sad. They said that this was a time for the people to thank God and honor Him together.

"Nehemiah told the people . . .

Open the Bible to Nehemiah 8:10 (NIrV) and read.

"Go and enjoy some good food and sweet drinks. Send some of it to people who don't have any. This day is holy to our Lord. So don't be sad.

Remove the tear from the emoji and read the rest of Nehemiah 8:10 (NIrV).

"The joy of the LORD makes you strong.

Flip the mouth so that it's smiling.

"There. That's much better."

JOY

LEADER: JAMES "The people's tears turned to joy as they learned that it was time to celebrate one of God's feasts: Sukkot or the Feast of Booths.

Take the mouth off of the emoji. Add the party hat and noisemaker.

"This feast was a way to remember how God took care of His people in the wilderness after He led them out of slavery in Egypt.

"During this celebration, everyone lived in tents and booths. The people cut branches from olive, myrtle, and palm trees and brought them back to the city. There, they built shelters and lived in them for an entire week.

Put the large "booth" over the top of the emoji face.

"The people celebrated what God had done for His people in the past. They also celebrated what God had done right before their eyes, as He had helped them rebuild the city of Jerusalem."

VIDEO: BIBLE STORY Show on Leader's cue

SLIDE: Theme Background

WRAPPING UP THE STORY

LEADER: "The people were filled with joy as they reconnected with the God who loved them so deeply. (*Reference the 'celebrating' emoji.*)

"In fact, God's people had not celebrated the Feast of Booths in this way in hundreds of years! Each day, Ezra read more of God's laws to them. And the people began to understand all that God had planned for them.

"Just like they did, we should . . .

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "look for ways to celebrate what God has done.

"Let's talk to God right now and thank Him for being so good to us."

SLIDE: Theme Background

PRAY

LEADER: FANNY "Dear God, thank You for all that You've done for us! First of all, You made us, and You love us. You sent Your Son to die for us so we could live with You forever. Then there are all the wonderful things You've done for each of us individually in this room. You've given us family and friends, a roof over our heads, food to eat, and clothes to wear. You've given us a purpose and a good plan for our lives. We could start celebrating all that You've done now, and never stop. We are so thankful! We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen "

CLOSER. FANNY

LEADER: "When Nehemiah and the people finished building the wall, they celebrated! They read God's Word, and they took time to think back about all the ways God had been there for His people in the past. They made sure to honor God, because they knew He was the reason they were successful.

"We should celebrate God like that, too—not just on days like Christmas and Easter, but all the time. When God answers a prayer, when He helps us do something difficult, or when He works something out in our lives that we never saw coming, we should celebrate.

"God is always there to help us make wise choices, give us strength when we need it, and help us make things right with other people. He has a good plan for our lives. [Basic Truth] We can trust Him no matter what!

"Remember . . .

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Look for ways to celebrate what God has done. Say that with me."

LEADER and KIDS: [Bottom Line] "Look for ways to celebrate what God has done."

LEADER: "If you can't see something right now to celebrate, look back at the things God has done in the past. Look at the stories in the Bible. Think about how God created the world. Remember that He knows everything and can do anything. Think of how He sent His Son, Jesus, to die on a cross for your sins.

"And keep your eyes open for what God is doing in your life right now. There's SO much that we can celebrate when we take the initiative to look for it. In fact, we can talk about that some more in Small Group. Let's go!"

Dismiss kids to their small groups.

What You Do:

Download the slides and have them ready to use. If you do not have screen capabilities, you have Orange's permission to enlarge and print the slides on paper.

Cut a large circle out of the yellow felt. Either attach it to the stage wall, or put it on a posterboard.

Using the Emoji Pieces sheet for reference, cut out the other emoji pieces that you'll need from the colors of felt listed above. Make sure these pieces are sized proportionally for your yellow circle. Note: the "booth" will need to be sized to go over the top of the emoji face.
