LARGE GROUP: Story (25 minutes) • Worship (10 minutes)

Engage kids' hearts through a dynamic and interactive Bible story, worship, and prayer experience in a Large Group setting.

OPENER

LEADER: "Hello, road warriors! It's been a great month so far as we've discovered how we can 'ride with respect.'

Video (Media Package): Theme Transition to Virtue

"Respect is showing others they are important by what you say and do.

Video (Media Package): Virtue Transition to Theme

"God MADE us to show respect to others. Each person is made in the image of God, which means each person is so very special and valuable. When we treat others with respect, we show them how much they matter—to us and to God!

"Since we're talking about the rules of the road this month, I thought, what better way to practice showing respect than with a little bit of a test drive? Let me get two of you up here to be our first contestants.

Bring up two volunteers—ideally older kids. Have them put on the cardboard box "cars."

(to the two kids) "Looking good, [kids' names]! You look like you're ready to hit the road. But don't go yet, because first we need to set up your GPS instructions. (to audience) That's where all of YOU come in!

"Everyone on this side of the room, you'll be the GPS voice directing [kid's name]. The other side of the room, you'll be the GPS voice directing [kid's name]. Your directions need to be GPS-style, so things like *(robotic voice)* 'In two feet, turn right.' Make sure to use your best GPS voice, okay?

"[Kids' names], you've got to keep your eyes closed, but listen carefully and respect what your GPS directions are telling you. Don't go too quickly or you might head off course or crash into the other driver. Quick, look at your teammates so you know whose voices to listen for!

"When I shout out 'SWITCH,' then I'll choose another driver from your team to take over. You'll need to pass them the car. Then the new driver will keep going on the roadway with their eyes closed. We'll have a total of three drivers for each team, and we'll see which team can cross the finish line first!

"All right, it's time to get you two to the start line.

Walk both drivers to the start line.

"Drivers, eyes closed, please. On your mark, get set, go!

AUDIO: Fun instrumental music

Watch the action and make sure the drivers don't go too quickly. After they've gone for about 15 to 30 seconds, shout "SWITCH" and pick a new driver for each team. (Make sure to choose kids with their hands raised.) Do another switch as the drivers get over halfway to the finish line. Let the third set of drivers finish the race.

Note: Because all of the kids in the audience will be calling out directions, the drivers may not be very successful. You may need to help them out by pointing their shoulders in the right direction from time to time. Keep the tone light and fun and not overly competitive.

At the end of the "test drive," congratulate both teams and collect the cardboard box cars.

"That was a pretty wild test drive! Nice job of directing your drivers to the end of the course, everyone. Just so you know though, I recommend driving with your eyes open. That's just a good tip to remember for when you start driving. Okay, everyone, it's time to sing, dance, and worship God!"

WORSHIP

LEADER: "Before we get started, let's watch this video together.

"Jesus gave us the perfect example of how to show respect to others. He taught that we should **[Basic Truth]** treat others the way we want to be treated. That's a great way that we can show the people around us that they're important and valuable. Let's stand and sing this song together and ask Jesus to help us show love like He does.

"As we try to live each day by respecting others, we know that we're not alone. God gives us the power to follow Jesus' example. Let's sing this song that's all about that power God gives us!

BIBLE STORY

SETTING UP THE STORY

If you're using a timeline of printed images on the wall, you can reference it here.

LEADER: "We've made it through a lot of God's Big Story so far—all the way from the very beginning! (*Hold up Bible.*) Today, we're looking at what happened one day when Jesus was traveling with His disciples, and He arrived in the town of Bethany.

Tape the "BETHANY" poster sign to the wall.

"Jesus' friends Martha, Mary, and Lazarus lived there. They were all siblings, and they were close followers of Jesus. Martha welcomed Jesus into their home. It was an honor that Jesus had come to visit!"

MARY AND MARTHA

LEADER: "While Jesus spoke, Martha's sister, Mary, sat down to listen.

Set out the floor pillows under the "BETHANY" sign. Sit down among the floor pillows with your chin on your folded hands. Look up toward the back of the room and take a deep breath like you're listening intently.

Then stand up.

"But that's not what Martha did, as we read in Luke, chapter 10.

Open the Bible to Luke 10:40 (NIrV) and read.

"Martha was busy with all the things that had to be done.

"Now, we don't know exactly what Martha had to do.

Bring out the dry erase board or easel pad and set it up opposite from the floor pillows.

"Maybe she had to . . . (Write a check next to each item on the checklist as you say it.) Set out the figs and olives for an appetizer, chop the veggies, roast the lamb, make the bread, BAKE the bread, clean the kitchen, set out the bowls. Make sure the WHOLE house was clean and ready for visitors.

"It seems that Martha felt annoyed, because she felt that she had to do all these important chores while Mary got to just sit and spend time with Jesus. At last, Martha couldn't keep quiet anymore. She went up to Jesus and said . . .

Open the Bible to Luke 10:40 (NIrV) and read.

"Lord, my sister has left me to do the work by myself. Don't you care? Tell her to help me!"

ONLY ONE THING

LEADER: "What do you think happened next? Do you think Jesus was angry with Martha for interrupting? Or do you think He told Mary to go help Martha with all the chores around the house?

"Jesus didn't do either of those things. He said . . .

Open the Bible to Luke 10:41-42 (NIrV) and read.

"Martha, Martha . . . You are worried and upset about many things.

Wave your hand over Martha's "to-do list."

"But few things are needed. Really, only one thing is needed.

Sit down again among the floor pillows.

"Mary has chosen what is better. And it will not be taken away from her.

Stand back up.

"Notice that Jesus didn't say that it was wrong for Martha to do all those important chores. It was true that those things needed to get done. But think about what Mary did. She chose to give her time and attention to Jesus while He was there with her."

YOUR LIFE

LEADER: "You and I aren't that different from Martha. We have some important tasks to do, too!

Erase the dry erase board or flip to a new page on the easel pad.

"What are some things you have to do each day?

Take some answers from the kids. Write them in shorthand on the dry erase board or easel pad, with a box for each one. If needed, offer some suggestions, such as . . .

"Make your bed. Go to school. Go to sports or dance practice. Do your chores. Do your homework. Brush your teeth.

"And maybe once you finish all those things, you know you'll get to spend some time doing things you really enjoy, like:

"Playing video games. Watching TV. Reading for fun.

"That's a good checklist of things we do each day. But what are some things that might be missing from this list?

On the board or easel pad, write symbols that represent the following items on the opposite side from the checklist.

"How about . . . spending time with your family?

Draw some stick figures.

"Maybe you eat together around the table and talk about how everyone's day went. Or maybe you take some time to play with your little brother or sister.

"What about other people in your life?

Draw a few more stick figures.

"Maybe you go visit your grandparent who's feeling sick . . . or your elderly neighbor. Maybe you spend some time with your friends and really ask what's going on in their lives. You take time to listen if they want to talk.

"It's also important to spend time with God.

Draw a simple outline of a Bible and praying hands.

"That could mean reading the Bible or taking time to talk to God and pray."

Move to the front of the stage as you wrap up.

WRAPPING UP THE STORY

LEADER: "Think back to what Jesus said to Martha. Jesus knew that Martha had important work that had to be done. But Martha had gotten distracted from the most important way of showing love to Jesus . . . through her time and attention.

"As we think about the way we spend our time each day, let's make sure that we take time for other people. Let's take time for our relationship with God. Let's not be so busy DOING things that we forget to show others they're important.

"That's what we need to remember today.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Take time to show others they are important.

"Let's pray."

PRAY

LEADER: "Dear God, we know that it's important for us to spend time with You and take time to show others that they matter to us. We know that those are the most important ways we can spend our time. But sometimes we can feel like Martha did. There are a lot of things that take up our time and attention—and many of them are things that we simply have to do. So please give us wisdom on how to spend our days, our hours, and our minutes. No matter how much we have to do, help us **[Bottom Line]** take time to show others they are important. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

CLOSER

LEADER: "It's important to point out that Martha was doing good work—important work! She was doing work FOR Jesus. But Martha was so focused on the work she was doing FOR Jesus that she missed out on spending time WITH Him.

SLIDE: God's Big Story Timeline

SLIDE: Week 3 Timeline Image

If you're making a timeline of printed images on your wall, take this moment to place today's timeline image on the clothesline.

"Let's remember this story and think of how we can take time for others. Let's not just spend our entire day getting things done that HAVE to be done.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Take time to show others they are important. Say that with me."

LEADER and KIDS: [Bottom Line] "Take time to show others they are important."

"That could mean that we spend time with God by praying, reading the Bible, or listening to worship music. It could mean that we take time to really listen to the people around us and show how much we care.

Share a brief personal story of a time when someone spent time with you and made you feel special and loved.

"I bet you can come up with some great ideas of how we can **[Bottom Line]** take time to show others they are important. Let's talk about it in Small Group!"

Dismiss kids to their small groups.

What You Do:

- Use the two large boxes to make two wearable "cars." Fold in the flaps of each box so it becomes something the kids can step through. Attach yarn on each end of the box to make straps that will go over the kids' shoulders. Then have fun decorating the "cars" as simply or elaborately as you'd prefer.
- Clear a space in your Large Group room for a taped pathway, making sure it's wide enough for two people to use. Make sure to include start and finish lines.
- Option: Use items such as orange cones, empty boxes stacked to resemble buildings, chairs with a pool noodle balanced on top to resemble a bridge they have to go under, etc. If you'd like, you can even have volunteers stand in the course to be pedestrians the racers have to avoid.

What You Do:

Download the slides and have them ready to use. If you do not have screen capabilities, you
have Orange's permission to enlarge and print the slides on paper.

As you tell the story, you'll set up two vignettes on the stage: on one side, you'll make a cozy
scene with floor pillows. On the other side, you'll set up the dry erase board or easel pad with
the marker.

- Ahead of time, on the dry erase board or easel pad, write check boxes and shorthand for Martha's to-do list: Figs/Olives, Roast Lamb, Make Bread, Bake Bread, Clean Kitchen, Bowls, Clean House.
- Write "BETHANY" on a posterboard
