<u>LARGE GROUP:</u> Story (25 minutes) • Worship (10 minutes)

Engage kids' hearts through a dynamic and interactive Bible story, worship, and prayer experience in a Large Group setting.

OPENER

LEADER: "What's going on, my fellow travelers? It's been an incredible month on the road with all of you. We've been talking about the rules of the road and finding out how we can 'ride with respect.'

"Can anyone tell me what respect means? (Pause for response.)

Video (Media Package): Theme Transition to Virtue

"Respect is showing others they are important by what you say and do.

Video (Media Package): Virtue Transition to Theme

"If you're driving down the street, it's important that you respect the rules of the road . . . or else you might bump into something or get a ticket! Today, we'll see just how well you can 'ride with respect' with a little twist on the game 'Red Light, Green Light.'

"All of you will line up behind the starting line over there and listen for me to call out directions. When I say 'Green light,' that means you can walk NOT run toward me, and try to cross the finish line. You must have a foot on the ground at all times. But when I say, 'Red light,' that means you have to stop immediately. If you keep going for even a half a second longer and I see you, you'll be out. But if I say 'Yellow light,' you can start moving again, but only in slow motion. (*Demonstrate*.)

"Here's one twist on the game. I'll hold up a sign that either has a red light, green light, or yellow light. And the sign may or may not match what I say! But you need to follow the stoplights, even if I SAY something different. Tricky, right?

"And the other twist is this: If I call you out for not following the stoplights, then you need to come take one of these 'Road Hazard' signs (hold one up) and sit somewhere in the middle of our playing area. If you want, you can even sit right in front of someone who's still in the game to make it extra challenging for them. Ha!

"To recap, green light (hold up the green paper), go; red light (hold up the red paper), stop; and yellow light (hold up the yellow paper), slow motion. Follow the signs, NOT my verbal cues. And if you get out, grab a 'Road Hazard' sign, and you can sit in the middle and be . . . well, a road hazard. Got it?

"Everyone, line up behind the starting line. Let's play 'Red Light, Green Light, Twist!'

AUDIO: Fun instrumental music

As you play the game, hold up the pieces of colored paper and call out directions. Most of the time, match what you say to the color you hold up. But occasionally, try to trick the kids by holding up a color that's different from the one you call out.

Make sure you don't stay on "green light" for too long so that the game isn't over too quickly. Pay close attention to see who messes up and give them signs so they can become "road hazards."

As soon as one kid crosses the finish line, the game is over. If you have time, you can let everyone back in the game and play another round.

"You all are great at following the rules of the road. Even when you messed up and had to be a road hazard, you showed respect for the rules of the game. So, way to go! Now, everyone jump to your feet. Let's keep the fun going as we worship God together!"

WORSHIP

LEADER: "Each day, we can live with respect and show others they're important. That's what Jesus does for us. We know that Jesus loves us and that He's always with us! So, we can be brave when we face obstacles in our lives. Jesus Himself said, 'In this world you will have trouble. But be encouraged! I have won the battle over the world.' (*John 16:33, NIrV*) I DO feel so encouraged when I remember that Jesus is with me—and He's bigger than anything I might face. Let's sing this song to worship Him!

"We can show respect to others when we first remember how much God loves us. God made each of us special and SO very valuable. God is there through anything we face in life—the good times and the tough times. Let's sing now and tell God, 'You're everything to me.' Here we go!

BIBLE STORY

SETTING UP THE STORY

If you're using a timeline of printed images on the wall, you can reference it here.

LEADER: "Over the past few months, we've been making our way through God's Big Story—all the way through the Bible! (*Hold up Bible.*) We're now in the New Testament. We're finding out how Jesus lived and how He showed love to everyone He met.

"Jesus spent His time traveling from town to town, teaching and healing people along the way. The town of Capernaum was like His home base. Everyone there knew about Jesus—not just the Jewish people, but also the Romans, who were in charge at the time. One of the Romans who knew about Jesus was a commander in the Roman army.

"You're not going to believe this, but we actually have this Roman commander here today. I figure we can interview him about his conversation with Jesus.

"Please welcome . . . the commander!"

The "commander" enters the room. He nods and looks serious but still friendly.

A MAN WHO COULDN'T WALK

LEADER: "Hello, commander. I'm so glad you could join us today! I know you have an important job commanding at least 100 soldiers."

COMMANDER: "Yes, indeed I do. In fact, it looks like I see some of them out there. You *(pointing to all of the kids),* stand at attention. Now, drop and give me ten! That's right, ten push-ups!

Pause while the kids do this. (Note: The tone of this should be lighthearted and fun—not scary for little kids.)

"Okay, at ease, soldiers. Back in your seats."

LEADER: "Wow, that was impressive. So yes, as you can see, our friend the commander here has a lot of authority. Anything he commands his soldiers to do, they do—no questions asked.

(to the commander) "I was just about to start telling these kids—I mean, soldiers—about the time you met Jesus. But since you're here, I can just interview you, if that's okay. (Pause.) I mean, permission to interview you, sir?"

COMMANDER: "Permission granted."

LEADER: "So I understand that you had a sick servant at home, is that correct?"

COMMANDER: "Ten-four."

LEADER: "I heard that this man was so sick that he couldn't move. So he was suffering pretty badly."

COMMANDER: "Affirmative."

LEADER: "Then you came to ask Jesus for help. And He offered to come and heal your servant?"

COMMANDER: "Yes, [sir or ma'am]."

LEADER: "Wow, that must have been pretty awesome to have Jesus, the Son of God, offer to come and help! What did you say to Him?"

THE COMMANDER'S RESPONSE

COMMANDER: "It's actually written down right here. (Hold up Bible.) I said to Jesus . . .

Commander opens the Bible to Matthew 8:8-9 (NIrV) and reads.

"Lord, I am not good enough to have you come into my house. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed.

Leader looks like he's about to speak, then the commander continues.

"I myself am a man under authority. And I have soldiers who obey my orders. I tell this one, 'Go,' and he goes. I tell that one, 'Come,' and he comes."

LEADER: "It sounds like you really understand how authority works, Mr. Commander. You know that when you give a command, you speak with the power of the Roman emperor, and that command is carried out right away.

Commander nods.

"So you knew that Jesus' power and authority were so great that all Jesus had to do was speak a word, from anywhere, and your servant would be healed!"

COMMANDER: "Exactly."

HEALING FROM AFAR

LEADER: "I imagine that Jesus must have been pretty amazed by your faith. Actually, I think we know what Jesus said because it's right there in the Bible. Permission to read from the Bible, sir?"

COMMANDER: (Hand the Bible over.) "Permission granted."

LEADER: "Jesus turned to His followers who were there and said . . .

Open the Bible to Matthew 8:10 (NIrV) and read.

"What I'm about to tell you is true. In Israel I have not found anyone whose faith is so strong.

"Nice job, Mr. Commander! Then Jesus said to you . . .

Open the Bible to Matthew 8:13 (NIrV) and read.

"Go! It will be done just as you believed it would."

COMMANDER: "That's right."

LEADER: "And your friend, your servant, was healed immediately."

COMMANDER: "Immediately."

LEADER: "Jesus didn't even have to go to your house."

COMMANDER: "He didn't even have to go to my house."

LEADER: "Incredible! Hey, Mr. Commander, thank you so much for coming to share your story with us today."

COMMANDER: (nodding) "Of course."

The commander waves and leaves the stage.

WRAPPING UP THE STORY

LEADER: "Okay, we're having some fun with this story today, but everything you just heard really did happen. Jesus did heal the servant of the commander—from far away! And the commander? He knew there was something special about Jesus. He had respect for Jesus as the greatest authority of all: the Son of God.

"As we've seen, God can do the impossible with a single word. God is all-powerful AND all-loving. That means God deserves our ultimate respect. We should put God first in everything we do.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Remember God is most important.

"Let's talk to God about that now."

PRAY

LEADER: "Dear God, You ARE the most important! You are the one we should respect and honor more than anything or anyone in this world. And You've given us the ultimate example of how we can treat people with love and kindness. Help us live in a way that makes it clear that You are the most important part of our lives. We love You, and we pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen."

CLOSER

LEADER: "That was a really impressive story, wasn't it? The commander came to Jesus because he believed that Jesus could heal his servant. The commander had so much respect for Jesus and His authority that he knew Jesus could heal his servant with a single word—without even entering his house!

SLIDE: God's Big Story Timeline

SLIDE: Week 4 Timeline Image

If you're making a timeline of printed images on your wall, take this moment to place today's timeline image on the clothesline.

"Our lives are full of all kinds of good things. But nothing is better or more important than our relationship with God. We should put God first, above everything else!

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Remember God is most important. Say that with me."

LEADER and KIDS: [Bottom Line] "Remember God is most important."

LEADER: "One great way that you can put God first is by taking time to pray. You can talk to God when you wake up . . . when you're feeling scared . . . when you're happy . . . when you go to bed at night, or just any time you want. God is ALWAYS there to hear you.

"No matter what challenges you face, whether it's a tough math test or if someone you love is sick, God is the One who can give you the strength, patience, and peace you need to get through your day. God sent Jesus to be our Savior and teach us how to live, by loving God and loving others. It's clear that God deserves our ultimate respect.

"Let's head to Small Group to talk about how we can make sure we put God first in our lives!"

Dismiss kids to their small groups.

3. Bible Story

What You Need:

- Leader
- Bible
- Adult volunteer (male) to play the role of the Roman commander
- Costume for the commander (can be an elaborate Roman gladiator-type costume or just a simple robe with a helmet)
- Printed script for the volunteer playing the commander
- Music stand

What You Do:

- Download the slides and have them ready to use. If you do not have screen capabilities, you
 have Orange's permission to enlarge and print the slides on paper.
- Choose a volunteer with a commanding presence to play the commander. The majority of the speaking for this person will be simple responses to the Leader's questions, but the volunteer should be able to convey authority.
- Have a printed script on a music stand as a guick reference for the volunteer.
- If possible, rehearse ahead of time with the volunteer playing the commander, so you can get the timing down.
